



DRESDEN COASTER INSTRUCTIONS



3 Hoop Sizes

5x5
6x6
8x8

- Quick Stitching
- No hand sewing required
- Great way to use up scraps of Fabric

MATERIALS

- Water Soluble Stabiliser to fit hoop
- Sharp scissors
- Matching Bobbin Thread

	5x5 hoop	6x6 hoop	8x8 hoop
Thin Batting	6x6 inch	7x7 inch	9x9 inch
Backing	6x6 inch	7x7 inch	9x9 inch
Front Dresden	6x6 inch	7x7 inch	9x9 inch
Centre **Optional	3x3 inch	4x4 inch	5x5 inch

PREPARATION – COASTER

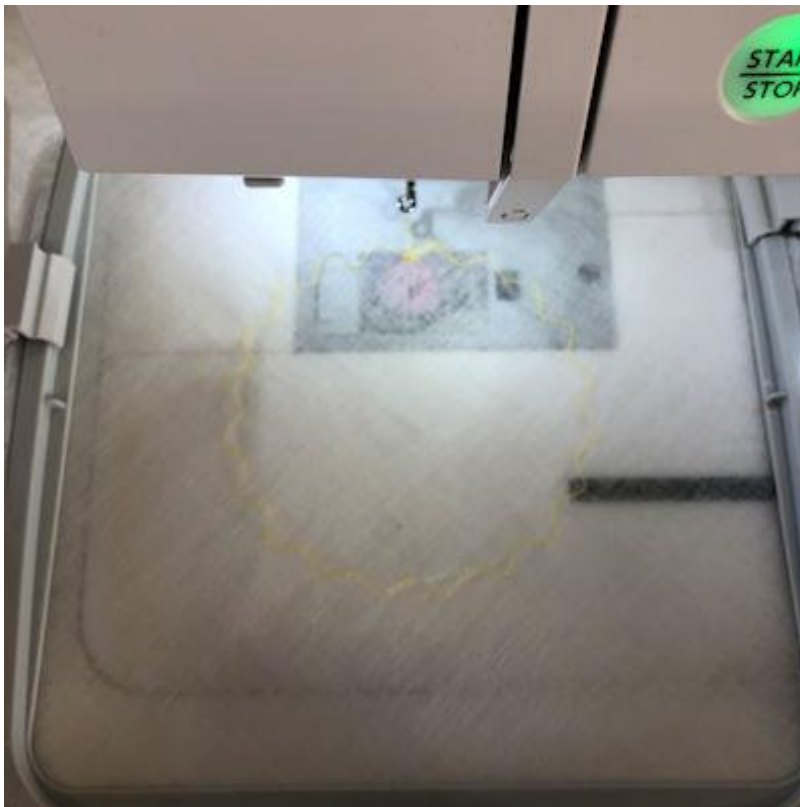


TIP for Cotton Fabric

I have been using a very thin iron-on Interfacing on the Coaster backing fabric – it just makes the fabric easier to cut on the back of the hoop, and no threads peeking out of the satin stitch.

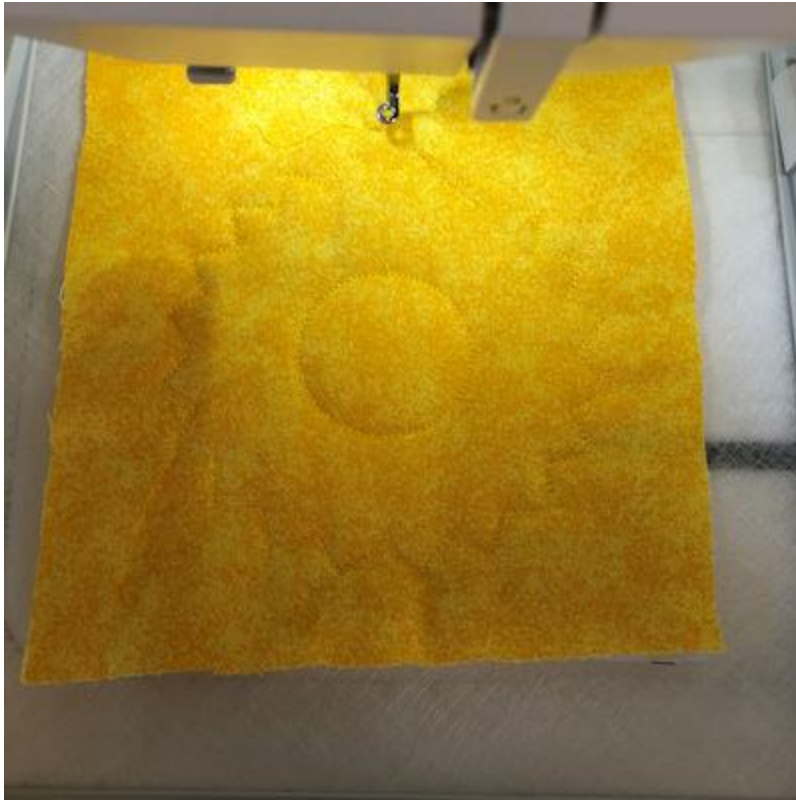
CONSTRUCTION

- Load design to machine
- Hoop 2 layers of Water Soluble Stabiliser
- Thread machine with a neutral color (I used yellow)



STEP ONE

Stitch Color 1 – the outline of the Coaster



STEP TWO

Place your BATTING
AND DRESDEN FABRIC
over the Guideline

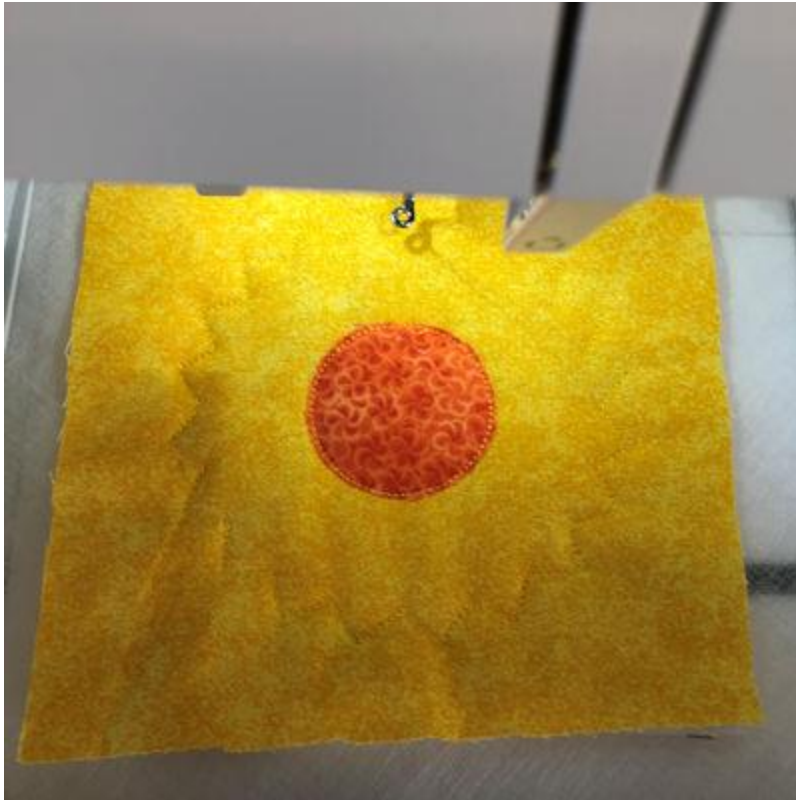
Stitch Color 2 to attach



STEP THREE

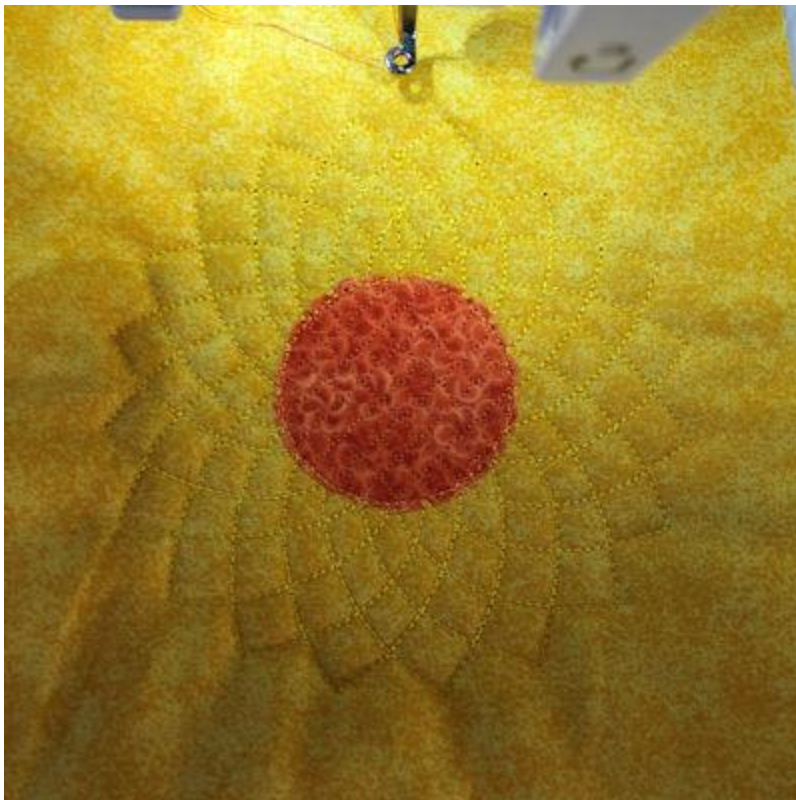
****Optional**
Place centre fabric over
the Guideline

Stitch Color 3 to attach



STEP FOUR

Cut away excess fabric from the centre



STEP FIVE

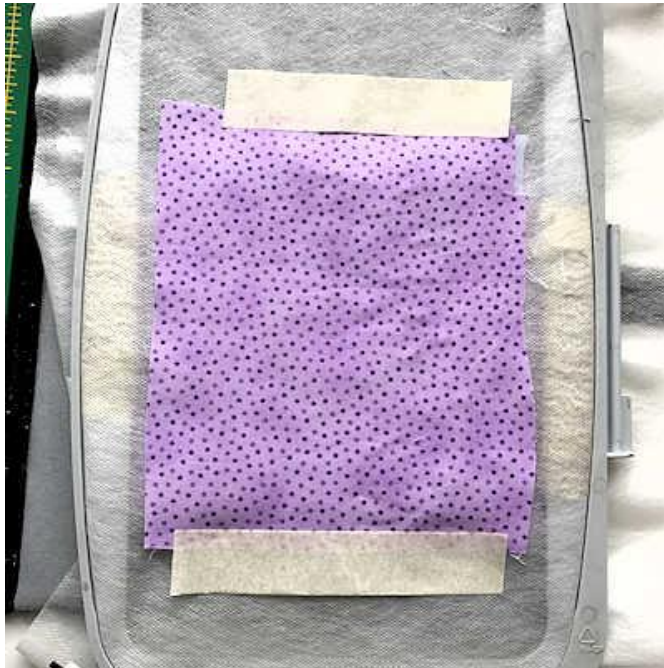
Change thread to colors you would like for the Quilting stitches

Color 4 – Dresden Quilting

Color 5 – Centre Quilting

Skip colors if you do not want to Quilt your fabric

ADD BACKING



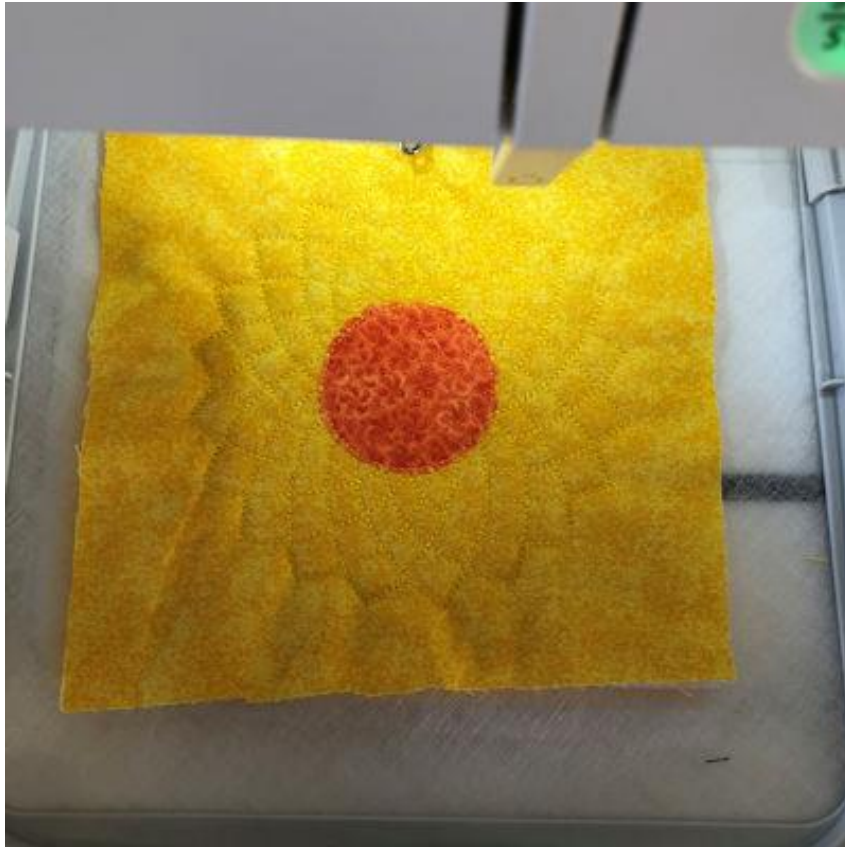
STEP EIGHT

Remove hoop from Machine, and tape Backing Fabric to hoop

**Wrong Side of
Fabric facing Hoop**



OR if you are comfortable with floating the backing, you can place the backing fabric under the hoop



STEP NINE

Return hoop to Machine

Stitch Color 6 to attach the backing



STEP TEN

Remove hoop from Machine

Cut away excess Fabric on FRONT and back of hoop





STEP ELEVEN

Return hoop to Machine

CHANGE BOBBIN TO SAME COLOR THREAD

Stitch Color 7 which zig zags, then Satin Stitches the 'petals' (yellow)

Color 8 stitches the Circle Satin Stitch

(we used same color in this sample)



STEP THIRTEEN

Remove from hoop

Cut away the excess Stabiliser around the edges

Use a Cotton Bud/Q Tip and warm water to dissolve any stabiliser left on the edges

FRONT



BACK



We just used the one fabric and thread for our Blue Coaster
