The **My Valentine Cat Coaster** is a fun, quick in-the-hoop design with a cheeky twist, finished with an envelope back for a neat, professional result.

The design is available in three sizes — 4x4, 5x5, and 6x6 hoops, making it perfect for a fast stitch or a thoughtful handmade gift for a fellow cat lover.

MATERIALS FOR COASTERS

- Cutaway stabiliser

FABRIC	4x4 hoop	5x5 hoop	6x6 hoop
Frame fabric (green)	1 piece 5 x 5 inch	1 piece 6 x 6 inch	1-piece 7x7inch
Inner fabric (white)	1 piece 4 x 4 inch	1 piece 5 x 5 inch	1 piece 6 x 6 inch
Batting	1 piece 5 x 5 inch	1 piece 6 x 6 inch	1 piece 7 x 7 inch
Backing fabric	2-pieces 6 x 5 inch Folded to 3 x 5 inch	2-piece 8 x 6 inch Folded to 4 x 6 inch	2-piece 7 x 10 inch Folded to 7 x 5 inch

STABILISER AND HOOPING

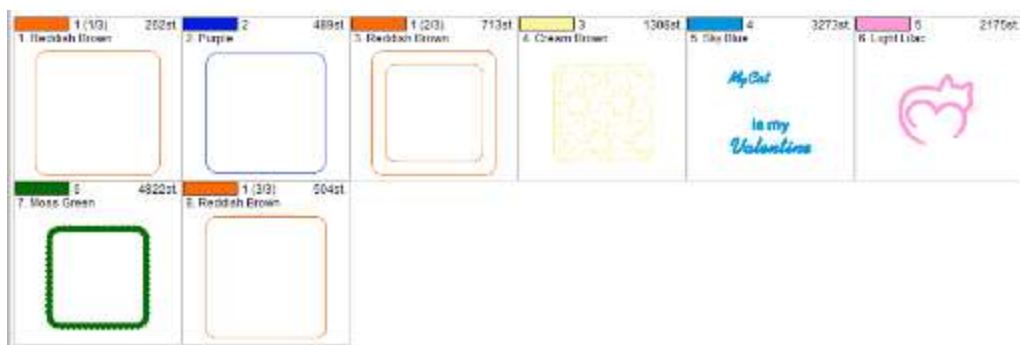


Hoop stabiliser

Use pins at the hoop edge to ensure no stabiliser movement

CONSTRUCTION



STEP ONE – THE FABRIC PLACEMENT LINE



Thread your machine with a neutral colour

Stitch Colour 1, which is the outline of the design and shows you where to place your fabric

STEP TWO – BATTING



Place thin batting over the guideline

Stitch Colour 2 to attach



Cut away excess batting

There is a small gap between the original outline and the batting, this is correct, it keeps the batting out of the seams

STEP THREE – ADD FABRIC



Place your frame fabric over the guideline

Stitch Colour 3 – to attach

Placement line for the inner fabric is stitched



OPTIONAL

If, like my sample, you have a dark fabric, you can cut away the inner fabric, so it does not show through your lighter top fabric



Place your inner fabric
over the guideline

Stitch Colour 4 to attach



Stitch inner design

Colour 5 – My Cat
wording (red)

Colour 6 – cat
(gray)



Cut away excess inner fabric



Stitch Colour 7 to zigzag, then complete the inner satin stitch edge (red)

STEP FOUR – ENVELOPE BACK



Place the first backing piece:

Position your first piece of backing fabric *inside the hoop*, with the **folded edge facing inwards**. Align it so it covers the placement guidelines but leave a **gap at the TOP** where you can still see the embroidery stitching.



Add the second backing piece:

Now place your second backing piece on top, again with the **folded edge facing inwards**. Position it so it overlaps the first piece.



OPTIONAL:

Place a layer of plastic solvy topper over all fabric

This ensures your presser foot will not get caught in the fabric edge



Secure the backing:

Stitch **Colour 8** to attach both backing pieces to your project.

STEP FIVE – FINISH



Carefully cut away the excess stabiliser and fabric around the outer edges of your project. Be sure to leave a **¼ inch seam allowance** all the way around.


For a smoother finish when turning your project right side out, **clip around any curved edges**, being careful not to cut through your stitching.



Turn your project right side out through the opening between the envelope backing pieces. Use a blunt tool (like a turning stick or chopstick) to carefully push out the corners and curves.

Press:

Once turned, press your project flat with a warm iron, taking care around the edges to give it a crisp, finished look.
